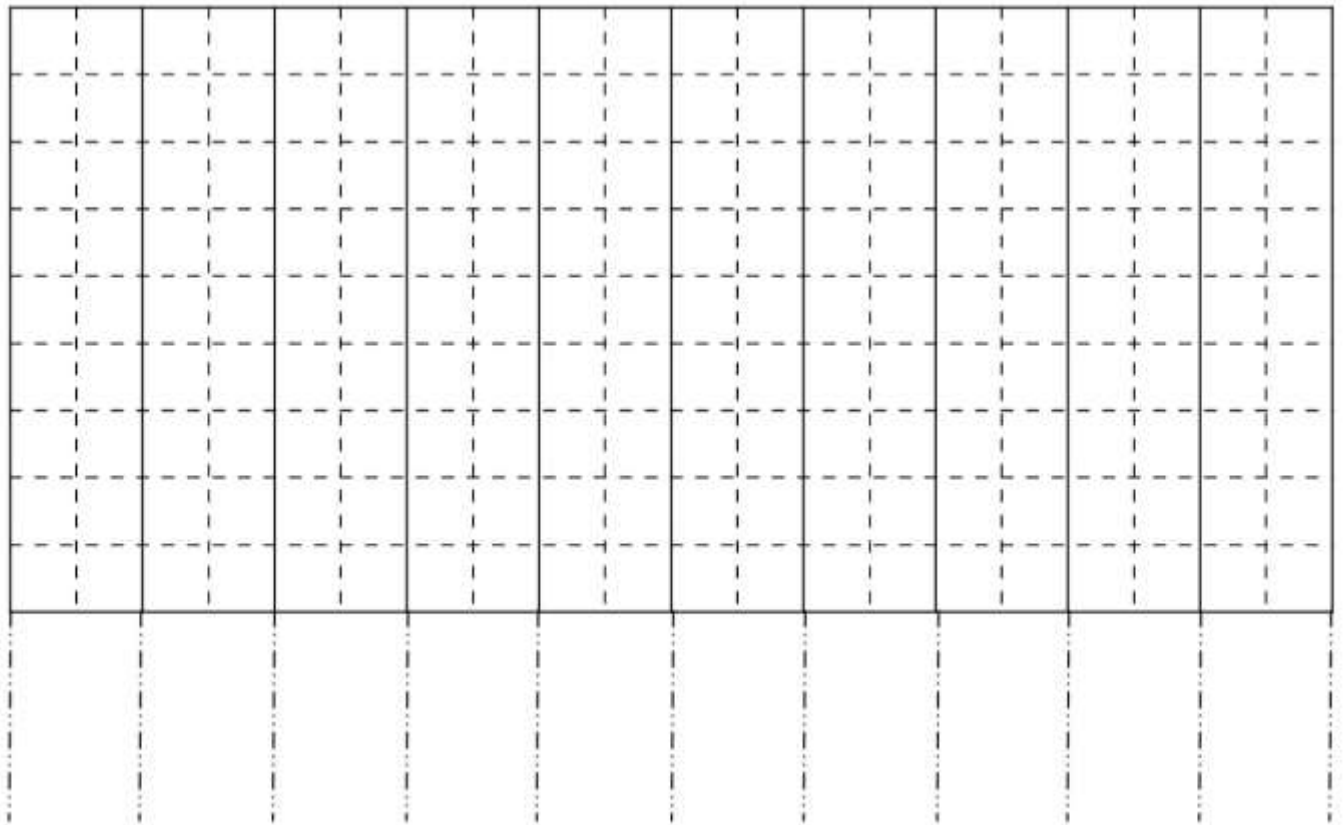

Part 2: TIPS FOR MAKING A SURVEY

- **Use simple and direct language**

This is easier for people to understand your questions when you ask them.

- **Be specific**

Ask questions which help you get the best results for your bar graph.

E.g. *Do you exercise regularly?* VS. *How many days a week do you exercise?*

- **Have an introduction**

Before you ask people questions, tell them why you are doing your survey.

E.g. *“All 2nd year students at Senri High School go on an international school trip. We are conducting a short survey to find out the most popular school trip destination 1st year students would like to visit next year. Would you like to participate?”*

- **Ask for basic information**

For some surveys, **gender** (M/F/NB¹) and **age** of the participant can affect your results.

Remember, **be respectful**☺ If someone doesn't want to share personal information about themselves, that's OK. If you think personal information will greatly affect your survey, **be polite**. Use ranges if asking people about their age. E.g. *15~19, 20~25, 26~30 etc.*

- **Ask different kinds of questions**

Asking many kinds of questions makes it easier to get a wider range of results which you can use for your bar graph and to help you understand/explain the results.

TYPES OF QUESTIONS:

To get the best results for your bar graph, there are many different kinds of questions you can ask:

- Open ended (*the participant's original answer*)
- Yes/No
- Multiple Choice (*A, B, C, D*)
- Checkbox (*for choosing more than one answer*)
